



Tower Rules

1. Agreement to having read and understood these rules must be signed for by the camp leader before commencement of the activity, whom will be responsible for the duration of the activity booking.
2. Only Persons with the appropriate M form authorisation may lead activities on the tower. This Person must be in attendance at all times the tower is in use. The activity must be run within the M form authorisation restrictions.
3. M forms must be shown to the duty warden prior to the activity commencing.
4. The activity leader must ensure that adequate first aid cover is available at the activity.
5. The drop area around the bottom of the tower must be roped off before commencement of the activity and before any set up on the tower takes place by the instructor, with the rope provided.
6. Helmets must be worn inside the roped area.
7. Activity leaders must read the Tower risk assessment and campsite rules before commencing the activity.
8. The ladder must be locked at all times the tower is not supervised.
9. All persons must be on a safety rope or other safety device to prevent falling if they are above the ground.
10. The activity must be run in accordance with the Scout Association's publications.
11. Only properly fitting helmets and harnesses may be used.
12. Only members of the Scout Association may use the tower unless prior permission in writing has been gained from the District Commissioner after proof of the necessary extension of insurance cover has being provided to Headquarters.
13. All equipment must be checked before use.
14. The Equipment log must be completed by the activity leader after each session.
15. Safety ropes must be used at all times by all persons climbing and abseiling.
16. When the Tower is not supervised the bottom of the climbing wall must be locked.
17. Rope systems must be set in such a way that an instructor can lower a person to the ground in the event of an emergency.
18. No jewellery can be worn on the tower.
19. Loose hair and clothing must be prevented from becoming entangled in the rope system.
20. Activities on the Tower must be stopped if the Weather or Horseplay could cause a risk to Safety.
21. Activities on the tower must run to S.P.A.
22. Safety is priority at all times on the Tower.
